Devotional Material:

 Designed to be a guideline. We realize that not everyone is experienced in teaching Bible studies, so we have prepared it so that it can be read straight through. However, it is flexible enough that you can make this your own.

• 4-9s

- More teaching-based, you do much more of the talking.
- Objective: This is the goal of the lesson. No matter how you go about teaching, this idea should come across.
- Verse: To be read aloud. Memory verse will be in bold. Work on memory verse with the kids. Kids will be given cards with verse on them to take home. Kids who are able to recite the verse next week will be given a ticket for snack stand rewards.
- In the Word: The meat of the teaching. Written to be read if necessary, but I encourage you to make it your own. Make sure you stick to the ideas, but the delivery is up to you.
- On the Field/Off the Field: The lesson applied both to sports and real life. Listed are some ideas, but feel free to come up with your own or have kids come up with ideas. Emphasize putting this into practice during the game.
- The game plan: Key points/takeaways from the lesson. These are for you to do, but are not meant to be read out loud.

• 10-17s

- More conversation-based, aiming to get the players more involved.
- Objective, verse, on/off the field, and game plan sections are same as 4-9s. See above.
- Coaches Guide: Because the study is discussion-based, this section is for you to read beforehand to understand what we are trying to teach the kids. These are the ideas we want to convey.
- Team discussion: Questions/directives to guide your team in the discussion. You are free to add in/modify questions with the purpose of generating richer discussion, but be sure to stay on topic.
